# **CONNECT**RESEARCHER SURVEY

Researchers from 9 different UCLA departments conducted research at UCLA Lab School during 2008–2020. Over the last 15 years, research at the Lab School has reflected a variety of disciplines and methodological approaches. Nevertheless, a consistent finding in the survey is that researchers chose the school given its diversity, teacher knowledge of research, and CONNECT's support. Researchers reported high satisfaction with the research application process and ongoing support they received from CONNECT. They also mentioned that the research environment at the Lab School allows for multiple interactions with the school community. Their findings were disseminated across the research community and some had a direct impact in the Lab School classrooms.
